From the Pastor

We live on cycles, rhythms. We call these calendars and they give shape to our lives. Many live by the school calendar, which begins in the Fall. The celebrations include Thanksgiving Break, Winter Break, Spring Break, and the beloved Summer Break. There's a sports calendar, which does not exactly have a beginning or end, but has the major events of the Super Bowl, March Madness, Opening Day, The Masters, the World Series, among other high holy days. There are political calendars, weather calendars, and consumer calendars -- all which give shape to our rhythms and sense of time. And, it seems every month is set aside to celebrate something new. Each of these calendars shapes and forms us as people. They help prioritize our lives.

So it has been that overtime a calendar developed for the church year. The most important day in the church calendar year is the Lord's Day, but the church year gives an overarching pattern to our weekly observance. Rather than immerse us in the rhythm of school, sports, politics, or secular causes, the church calendar immerses us in the life of Christ. After all, if we want the rhythm of our life to reflect anything it is the life of Jesus Christ.

The calendar begins in Advent. We have just completed Epiphany, and on March 2 Lent begins. This sacred season draws us to the cross of Christ -- the defining act of the life of our Lord. It also reminds us of why he traveled the road to the cross -- our sin. Without Lent, Maundy Thursday, and Good Friday, Easter bells ring hollow. The season of Lent helps train us further and deeper in the act of repentance, which is the only way forward in the Christian life. The rhythm of the Christian life is repenting our way forward -- and Lent provides the training ground.

Historically, the season of Lent has been a time set aside for prayer. One of the best ways to learn how to pray is through the book of Psalms -- the prayer book of the Bible. For the next six weeks we will spend some time learning from six of these Psalms. In particular, we learn from them at the foot of the cross, as we hear them paired with the last words of our Savior -- last words that were also prayers.
