For our family, 2020 was filled with emotion: happy, sad, frustrated, joyful, angry, thankful, crazy, content, silly, but most of all HOPEFUL. Like many, our lives changed on Friday, March 13th. We had to make quick adjustments to homeschooling and "adjusted" social lives. With three kids at three different levels of learning, and all needing help at the same time, it was not an easy beginning. Thankfully, we found a rhythm that gave us consistency and peace. On Monday the kids and I would bike to coffee; on Tuesday the "boys" and the "girls" did separate movie nights; Thursday "mom's night of peace"; Friday the kids and I biked to ice cream, followed by homemade pizza and a family movie night; and on Sunday we did "home worship" with singing in the living room and Ms. Jennifer leading "facebook" Sunday School.

Our family's favorite tradition that we rekindled during this time was the evening family walk. Dave and I began our marriage going on regular walks, but these began to dwindle the more kids we had. In March, we'd leave the house every night and walk 2 miles around our neighborhood. We were able to connect, talk and sometimes just walk in silence hand in hand and trust in our Faithful God.

Our kids are happy, healthy, and ever adapting to this new way of living. They currently (as of December) attend school five days a week. They meet in person with face masks and social distancing. The boys have turned our downstairs into legoland. Mary and I enjoy simple tea parties and coloring. Dave has continued to maintain his running, reading, and chasing around the kids. We have also all enjoyed the addition of Henry -- our "COVID dog" -- who provides endless entertainment.

This year was unexpected, but that's the nature of life. Life is always changing, but there is one constant -- one gift that can never be taken --Our Lord God and His faithfulness. So we stand on that rock as we see the joy in each day. Most of all, we are grateful we can travel this journey with you. The Apostle Paul expressed well our own feeling toward you: "I thank my God in all my remembrance of you, always in every prayer of mine for you all making my prayer with joy, because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now."
