Our mission statement reads: "First Presbyterian Church is called by God to be a spiritual home where we seek, encourage and equip people to live as life-long followers of Christ." While God sends all of us out as missionaries to witness to his love, God also gathers us at 1122 Diagonal to encounter us. Summer camp is a great place to encounter the Lord, and let us not forget he would do the same here at 1122 Diagonal. When Lord's Day worship becomes part of your summer rhythm and routine, just like summer campers, you'll begin to see him everywhere else in your life, wherever summer may take you.
