The assigned texts give us three 'sermons' of Jesus: The Whip Sermon, The Gospel Sermon, and The Crucified Sermon. Each of these will prepare our hearts to understand what Jesus Christ has done for us and for our salvation.

Book Notes (Gentle & Lowly by Dane Orlund)

Nearly a year into the pandemic and many of us have grown weary. We wonder where we can find some rest, some relief. We carry more burdens than we care to admit. We feel weighed down by circumstances beyond our control. If only we could find some relief. In the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus gives this invitation, "Come to me all of you who are weary and heavy laden and I will give you rest" (11:28). We know what Jesus has done for us, but do we know Jesus' heart for us sinners and sufferers? This heart is exactly what Dane Ortlund wants to reveal to us in his short book, *Gentle and Lowly*. In it, he carefully and clearly reminds us of the heart of Jesus Christ. Every time I opened the book I found myself drinking from rich waters to quency my weary soul. Frequently, Ortlund's insights would move me from reading into praying. Most of all, he pointed me to the Savior who provides rest for our souls. If you have found yourself weighed down in the wilderness of the pandemic, I would highly recommend you journey with *Gentle and Lowly* and so find living waters for your parched soul.
